



## Welcome to Conclave University!

Great choice on deciding to attend this year's Conclave! For those who have never attended a Conclave, the morning is filled with three training sessions. This year, we have decided to create five different colleges and have a set of classes that work toward a specific subject. Attached is a list of the colleges and the classes from which you can pick. Pick only ONE college and THREE classes! When you register for Conclave, you will register for a "college" and the classes within that colleges that you want to take. Class times and locations will be available at Conclave.

### There are five areas of interest offered:

1. College of Kichkinet
2. College of Allowat Sakima
3. College of Nutiket
4. College of Meteu
5. The Block Schedule

**1. College of Kichkinet** – These Freshman Orientation courses are suggested for first year Conclave Arrowmen. This will explain what a Conclave is and what the OA has to offer in a fun way. Participants will earn a Bachelor's Degree in OA General Studies. You can select three classes from the following list:

1. What is Conclave?—Learn about what a Conclave really is! This class will give Arrowmen a full understanding of what a Conclave is and will include a brief tour of this year's Conclave. Participants will learn where everything is located.
2. OA Function—Ever wonder how exactly the OA operates? Learn how! Learn the basic idea of how the Order of the Arrow operates and what there is to do in the OA.
3. Frisbee Golf—Yes, this does say Frisbee golf! Who said we couldn't have fun? Learn how to play Frisbee Golf while learning different ideas about the OA.
4. The OA and your troop—Learn about how to bring the OA back to your troop. This class discusses the benefits to the individual, troop, district and council as a result of the Order of the Arrow's influence in your troop.

5. Geoscouting—Learn how to use a GPS! This class will teach you the fundamentals of geocaching and how it can help promote recruitment, retention, and public relations in Scouting.

**2. College of Allowat Sakima** – This college offers classes that will help current or future lodge/chapter officers. Participants will earn a Bachelor’s Degree in OA Management. You can select three classes from the following list:

6. Elangomats—Learn more about the Elangomat program! This class will go over how to be a successful Elangomat, what an Elangomat does during and after the Ordeal, and what to expect as an Elangomat.

7. Teamwork—This youth-only class focuses on how to make a great team. It will give you ideas on how to develop a well functioning team. This class will include team building activities and a short discussion and sharing of ideas on how a team should work.

8. Motivating Youth— This adult-only class will give adults ideas and ways to get their youth more active in the OA and get them something to do with the OA. Be sure to bring ideas, there will be a lot of discussion.

9. Event Planning—Learn how to make an event outstanding because of the planning! This more advanced class will let current and future lodge/chapter officers learn about how to plan a successful event.

10. Mentoring—Be that older Scout and work with a younger scout. This class will address various mentoring models and ways to be a mentor to Scouts and Scouters.

11. How to make a Fall Fellowship, a FALL FELLOWSHIP!—Need we say more? This class will involve the instructor discussing how to make your spring and fall fellowships a lot of fun. There will also be a discussion part of the class to share ideas.

**3. College of Nutiket**—This college offers all there is to know about Indian Lore. If you are interested in OA ceremonies, dancing, drumming, or Native American artwork, this is the college for you. Participants will earn a Bachelor’s Degree in Ceremonies & Native American Activities. You can select three classes from the following list:

12. Introduction into Ceremonies—Start with the basics. If you are new to ceremonies, this class will help you get your foot in the door for more advanced classes and opportunities for a spot on your lodge ceremony team.

13. Introduction to Dance—Learn the different styles and learn a little about each. In this class you will learn the basic idea and the different dance styles of the Native Americans. You will learn how to correctly dance and a general idea of what to wear.

14. Native American Clothing—Study the types of Native American clothing. If you are interested in making your own Native American outfit, this class will give you hands on experience.

15. How to run a successful Ordeal—Finish the Ordeal on time! This class will give you the leadership knowledge and experience needed to run a fun and productive Ordeal.

16. Cub Scout Crossover—Learn how to run Cub Scout crossovers, OA Style. Ever wanted to do an OA Cub Scout Crossover? Learn how!

17. Evaluator Training—Become an awesome evaluator for judging.

18. Ceremony Advisers Training—Get tips on how to become an awesome adviser.

19. Becoming your Character (Allowat Sakima)

20. Becoming your Character (Meteu)

21. Becoming your Character (Nutiket)

22. Becoming your Character (Kichkinet)

**4. College of Meteu**—New and old members of the Order of the Arrow are encouraged to attend this school to learn how to serve as an officer in the Order and the history of it. Participants will earn a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science. You can select three classes from the following list:

23. SR-6 History—Learn about the history of our section. This class will go over how our section has grown over the past and fun facts about the Section.

24. The Election Process—From unit elections to how to run for an office. Learn how to move your way up the ranks in the OA starting at the chapter level and possibly ending at the national level.

25. Where are they now?—Where are past OA officers now? This research-type class will give first hand examples of past section officers and where they are now in life.

26. What not to say—How to be an effective communicator. A key trait in any successful leader is to be able to communicate. Learn what to do and what not to do.

27. Meet the Chief—In this youth-only session, participants will meet our Region Chief, Don Combs! They can discuss the OA, learn what officers do, and ask questions to the leaders of our Order.

28. Advisers Forum—Participants in this adults-only session will meet our section adviser and have a discussion with him and other advisers about lodge issues. The class will offer how to be a good advisor, what a advisor does, and example issues of what might come up as an advisor.

**5. Block Schedule**—The Block Schedule provides and opportunity to select a more specialized in depth training for Youth and Adults. Participants will pick ONE subject, which will last all three sessions, and will earn a Bachelor's Degree in either Safety or Pre Medicine.

29. Chainsaw Safety Course—For adults over the age of 21. This class will earn the participant BSA certification in chainsaw safety.

30. CPR Certification— For mature Arrowmen who have an interest in learning the proper techniques for CPR and receiving BSA certification.

31. First Aid Certification— For mature Arrowmen who have an interest in learning proper techniques in first aid and receive BSA certification.

32. Wilderness First Aid— This class will let older Arrowmen learn the basics of wilderness first aid, but participants will not receive BSA certification.
